SCHOLARSHIPS FOR CONSIDERATION

1. Charles Himel

- a. Award amount = \$2,000 awarded to one or **divided** between two recipients
- b. For first generation students with demonstrated need. First generation is defined as the child of parents who do not have a 4 year college degree from an American college or university. Need is defined as a student on fee waiver.

2. E.F. Hildebrandt

- a. For student pursuing a career in a math related area or math instruction.
- b. Award amount = \$600

3. Helen Dobbins MTA (Maine Teachers Association) Award

- a. For a student interested in a career in teaching
- b. Award amount = \$1,500 for one or divided between two candidates

4. Clarke Duncan Scholarship Award

- a. Top half of class, high moral character, pursuing a future in English- related field, demonstrated improvement throughout high school career.
- b. Award amount = \$500

5. Senior Service Award

- a. For demonstrated contributions and volunteerism to the **school** community
- b. Service does not include required service as part of NHS or Leaders P.E.
- c. Award amount and number of recipients to be determined

6. SJB scholarship

- a. For students demonstrating leadership excellence and seeking a related career area
- b. 30 minute phone interview will be required for semi-finalists
- c. Award amount = 2 awards of \$2,000 each

7. Maine East Class of 1983

- a. For most improved student
- b. Award Amount = \$500
